DECEMBER CONSTRUCTION UPDATE

The Airport Link tunnel on-ramps at Kedron are currently being constructed within the Stafford Road (corner of Gympie Road) and Gympie Road east (from Kedron Brook to Arnott Street) worksites. Upon project completion in 2012, these ramps will enable motorists to enter the tunnel at Stafford Road and Gympie Road to travel to Bowen Hills or the Airport.

STAFFORD WORKSITE

Piling work for the Airport Link on-ramp and construction of the Airport Link Operations Centre noise wall will continue at the Stafford site until Christmas break which commences Thursday 24 December 2009.

SERVICE RELOCATIONS

Service relocation works are continuing in the Kedron area. Energex is currently undertaking works along Stafford Road to remove the overhead power supply and replace with an underground service. In addition, restoration works are progressing along Clarence Road, Broughton Road, Mitchell Street, Cremorne Road Nieppe Street and Somerset Road. This work will continue over the next three weeks.

GYMPIE ROAD EAST WORKSITE

At the Gympie Road east site, a series of concrete pours are underway to construct the tunnel roof for the Airport Link on-ramps. These concrete pours will continue until early 2010. The final section of piling within the Gympie Road (across Park Terrace) will commence this week and continue for three weeks.

KEDRON BROOK

From early December the Kedron Brook pathway will be detoured to the northern bank of the Kedron Brook. Pedestrians and cyclists will detour to the northern bank via two new pathway bridges located east and west of the Gympie Road bridge. The temporary pathway will be two metres wide. Access to the eastern side of Gympie Road from the Kedron Brook, including the bus stop, will also be via the pathway on the northern bank.

The Kedron Brook water flow has been diverted onto the northern bank to allow construction of the tunnel roof structure to progress through to the southern bank. Piling on the southern bank will continue until early 2010.

CONSTRUCTION ACCESS ROAD

A purpose built construction road will operate within the Kedron Brook area to reduce the use of local roads by construction and spoil haulage vehicles.

During operation of the construction access road, traffic control will be in place to manage the interaction of vehicles and pathway users.

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GYMPIE ROAD REALIGNMENT

The Northern Busway in the Kedron area will be located west of Gympie Road, commencing at Suez Street and surfacing north of Somerset Road. The first phase on the Northern Busway construction in the Kedron area will require changes to the Gympie Road corridor.

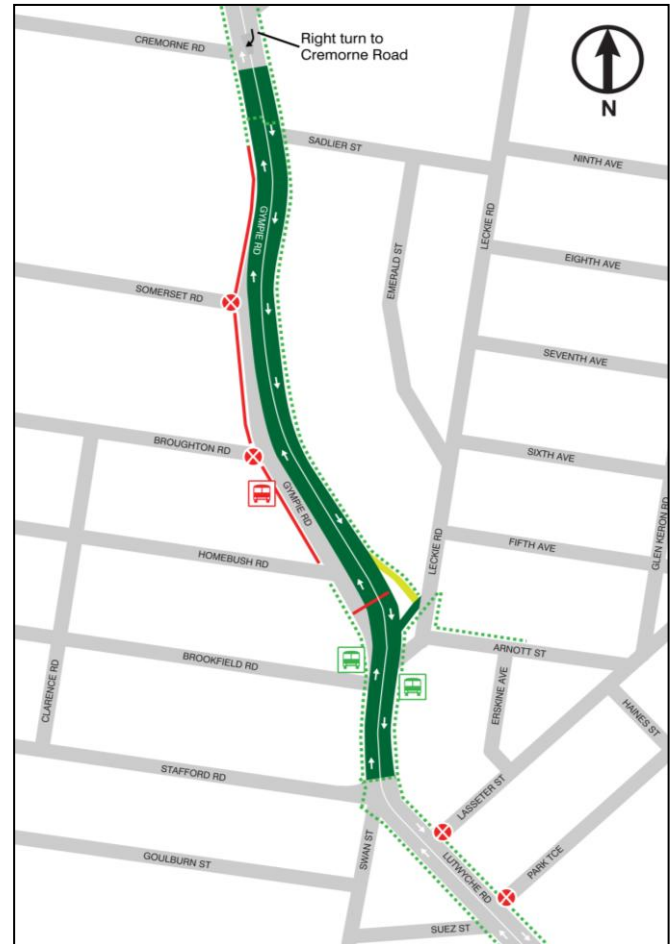
Changes to the northbound Gympie Road carriageway will be implemented 3 December 2009 between 9pm and 5am and operational by 4 December 2009.

WHAT TO EXPECT

- Implementation of the northbound lane Gympie Road realignment including pavement and line marking
- Construction noise from equipment including excavator, roller, concrete trucks, saw cutting, barrier relocation
- Construction vehicle movements and asphalting
- Lighting towers
- Multiple lane closures managed by traffic control

CHANGED TRAFFIC CONDITIONS FROM 4 DECEMBER 2009

- Diversion and operation of three northbound Gympie Road lanes, east from **north of Leckie Road to north of Somerset Road**
- The **Gympie Road western footpath** from Homebush Road to 120m north of Somerset Road will be closed. Pedestrians will access the eastern footpath at the signalised crossings located at the Stafford Road and Sadlier Street intersections.
- **Broughton Road and Somerset Road** will not be accessible to and from Gympie Road until mid – late 2010. Alternate access to and from these streets will be via the surrounding network including Brookfield Road, Homebush Road and a right turn from Gympie Road to Cremorne Road.
- **The Sadlier Street right turn bay** will be reduced and the **Castle Street turn bay** will be increased. Motorists are advised to proceed to the Castle Street intersection to access Leckie Road.
